# Plain Language Summary – Draft Municipal Planning Strategy



The Municipal Planning Strategy (MPS) sets the long-term vision for how land is used and developed in the Municipality of Clare. It helps guide decisions about housing, business development, recreation, infrastructure, and environmental protection.

## **Key Objectives:**

- Support growth in appropriate areas while preserving the rural and coastal character of Clare.
- Protect the environment and natural resources.
- Improve housing choices, especially affordable and seniors housing.
- Encourage local economic development like tourism, fisheries, agriculture, and small businesses.
- Plan for climate change and protect coastal areas from erosion and flooding.
- Preserve heritage and cultural assets, including Acadian culture and the French language.

### **Land Use and Development:**

- New growth will be encouraged in **municipally serviced areas**, for example, in areas serviced by municipal wastewater treatment systems (Meteghan, Meteghan River, Meteghan Centre, Church Point, Belliveau Cove) and active transportation options like sidewalks.
- Rural areas will remain primarily for resource-based uses and low-density housing.
- Mixed-use development (housing + businesses) will be encouraged in certain areas to create
  walkable communities.
- A clear **zoning system** will help control what types of buildings and activities can happen where, to avoid unwanted development.

#### Housing:

- Encourage a mix of housing types to meet needs for seniors, newcomers, seasonal workers, and families.
- Support secondary suites and accessory dwellings (like basement apartments or backyard units) to address various types of housing needs.

#### **Environment and Climate:**

- Protect wetlands, watercourses, and forests.
- Restrict development in high-risk coastal areas prone to sea-level rise or erosion.
- Promote sustainable practices like low-impact development, energy efficiency, and green infrastructure.

#### Infrastructure and Services:

- Encourage compact growth where there is sewer service and active transportation infrastructure.
- Plan for future upgrades to infrastructure as needed.
- Support active transportation like walking and cycling paths, through the development of an active transportation plan.

## **Culture and Heritage:**

- Recognize and protect historical buildings and cultural landscapes when it is fiscally appropriate.
- Promote use of French in public signage and communications.
- Support Acadian traditions and heritage tourism.

#### Implementation:

- The MPS will be followed by a Land Use By-law, which sets detailed rules about what can be built where.
- Regular reviews will keep the plan up to date with community needs and provincial requirements.
