#### **Upcoming and Ongoing Activities**

- Actifs après l'école: The school-based after school program continues in École Saint-Albert and École Jean-Marie
  Gay. Each school has a regular attendance of 10 to 13 participants. The program at École Joseph Dugas was
  terminated due to lack of monitor; An active search for a new monitor continues. École Stella-Maris continues to
  not offer the program.
- Facility Access: There are 3 swim sessions and 4 skate sessions planed for the month of November. Participation varies from 30 to 60 participants each week at both sessions.
- Soyons Actifs: Since the last report, there have been 2 swim sessions and 2 skate sessions. Participation continues to be great; between 50 to 70 participants each week, except for Halloween. We continue to offer a school bus for transportation to the program from all four elementary schools; there has been roughly 40 to 50 children using this service each week.
- Strategic Plan: The Citizen Survey, conducted by Nova Insights, has begun their telephone survey within our Municipality on November 3<sup>rd</sup>. The survey runs through a list of randomly selected phone numbers, or members of the community may call in and schedule a time if they are eager to participate. The survey will run until December 7<sup>th</sup>. The data collected from this survey is highly important for the renewal of the Strategic Plan.
- Winter Newsletter: A detailed list of winter activities, such as Geocaching, Défi Hivers and snowshoe loan, is underway for them to be included in the upcoming Winter newsletter.
